Program Description: This all-day program will focus on a variety of “hot” topics related to the field of pharmacy. The program will include an update on current pharmacological approaches for the treatment of HIV, secondary stroke prevention, diabetes treatment, and anemia in chronic kidney disease. In addition, this program will also present information concerning cultural competency and vaccinations.

8. Discuss antithrombotic agents newly FDA approved for secondary stroke prevention
9. Review cardiovascular risk reduction goals in the management of hypertension, hyperlipidemia, and diabetes
10. Describe the epidemiology and prevalence of HIV
11. Discuss the common adverse effects, dosing, and monitoring of antiretroviral agents
12. Describe aspects of a professional environment that encourages and embraces cultural awareness and sensitivity
13. Identify barriers to cultural awareness and sensitivity and compare and contrast examples of effective crosscultural communication
